What is Harmony Camp?

A non-denominational, culturally inclusive camp for children entering first grade through those entering sixth grade. This is the sixth consecutive year the camp has been held. There are places for 48 participants. Campers will experience:

- People of various cultures, ages, and abilities
- Values shared by diverse cultures
- Creativity and harmony through art, song, movement, and drama
- Respectful behavior toward oneself, one another, and our environment.
- By the end of the camp, it is hoped they will have discovered that we are more alike than different.

Who are the Staff?

- ❑ Terri Martin and Sally Andersen are Co-Directors of the camp for the third consecutive year. Both are teachers in Leon County public schools, with 37 years of experience between them. Terri's children have been campers each year.
- ❑ Experienced adult volunteers, including many teachers and other professionals. Many of the staff are returning for the sixth year. They are experts in music, the arts, education, cooking, and environmental education.

- Campers choose one class they most want to attend and one they do not want to attend. All other classes are assigned to give all children a balanced and diverse Harmony Camp experience.
